

Years 5 and 6

Mobile Phones

The children in years 5 and 6 can bring their mobile phone to school only if they walk home alone. The phones are collected on arrival to school and must be handed in. They are locked away safely and given back at the end of the day. If your child is bringing a phone to school, you must complete a form for them to do so. Please use the QR code shown. If your child wears a Smart Watch to school, this will need to be handed in with the mobile phones at the beginning of the day and will be given back at the end of the day.



<u>Year 6</u> - if you completed a form when your child was in year 5, you do not need to worry. If your child is bringing their phone in for the first time, please complete the form too.

Walking Home Alone

After School Club & Breakfast Club

Threadworms in school

Your child can generally go to school with common threadworms (pinworms) as long as they are being treated immediately with medication, but it's crucial to start treatment for the whole family, practice excellent hygiene, and inform the school so they can also take precautions against spreading the highly contagious eggs.

What to do if your child has threadworms:

· Start Treatment:

Get over-the-counter medicine from a pharmacist and treat the entire household, even if others show no symptoms.

· Inform the School:

Let the teacher know so they can encourage handwashing and hygiene, as eggs spread easily at school.

How threadworms spread

Threadworms spread when their eggs are swallowed. They lay eggs around your bottom (anus), which make it itchy. The eggs get stuck on your fingers when you scratch. They can then pass on to anything you touch, including:

- · clothes
- · toys
- · toothbrushes
- · kitchen or bathroom surfaces
- · bedding
- \cdot food

Eggs can pass to other people when they touch these surfaces and then touch their mouth. The eggs can survive up to 2 weeks. The larvae hatch from the eggs in your gut after you swallow them, and take 1 to 2 months to mature into threadworms.

Children can get threadworms again after they've been treated for them if they get the eggs in their mouth. This is why it's important to encourage children to wash their hands regularly.
